



## Student Information

### Health Insurance

The Health Insurance Card (also called the yellow card) gives you the right to free medical treatment by general practitioners and hospitals in Denmark. Dentists and medicine are only partly covered by this insurance and therefore can be quite expensive. We recommend that you take out a private health insurance in your home country if you wish to cover all expenses.

We also advise you to take out a personal accident insurance during your time in Denmark, which should also include liability insurance.

### Registration at the National Register

The National Register (Folkeregisteret) is the central register for all residents in Denmark. Foreign nationals are considered Danish residents when staying in Denmark for more than three months. All registered residents receive a personal registration number (cpr-number).

### Accommodation

If you require accommodation during your stay in Denmark, we can help you to arrange a room in Næstved. Rooms are furnished, typically with a bed, table, lamp and chair. Kitchen and bathroom facilities are usually shared with other students.

**Shared accommodation** (2 students in one room) will cost DKK 8,750 for 5 months plus a deposit of DKK 3,500. The deposit will be repaid upon departure, after the room and facilities have been inspected together with the students. Five months is the minimum contract period, and is compulsory for new students arriving from abroad.

**Single rooms** (1 student in a room) students requiring a single room should contact South Zealand Business College regarding rent charges and other details.

All students must bring bed linen, towels and other personal necessities. In Denmark we have duvets and special covers for them. These can easily be purchased upon arrival.
