For our Danish students, it is a good experience to meet other young people, not only in the daily life in our training facilities, but also in their spare time in our student dorm, which offers various leisure time opportunities for our boarding students.

ZBC has an international strategy, where an international view for all our students has high priority. We work continuously to further strengthen the number of out-going students as well as to create good interaction between our in-coming exchange students and our Danish students.

Our set-up with student dorms in three locations, combined with school based exchange programs varying from two to ten weeks, gives a unique opportunity for exchange students to get international experience.

Our professional staff offers support to students and accompanying teachers in all situations, from arrival to departure.

In order to enroll your students on our programs an EU- or Norwegian citizenship is required.

DENMARK AT A GLANCE

Denmark is a small Scandinavian country (43.098 km²) in northern Europe with a population of 5.585.000 (2012) of which 1.2 million live in Greater Copenhagen, the capital. ZBC's location is near to Copenhagen, with 18 colleges in eight different cities located all over Zealand.

Denmark has been a kingdom since approx. 900 AD and has been a constitutional monarchy since 1849.

The Kingdom of Denmark also comprises the Faroe Islands and Greenland; nations that today enjoy extensive home rule and have their own parliaments, culture and language. The official language in Denmark is Danish but English is widely spoken.
